VOTER REGISTRATION

- All voters must be 18 and a US citizen. Must be registered 20 days before any election.
- Only need to register ONCE, UNLESS you move or want to change your party affiliation.
- Register via mail, in person at Clerk's office or online at www.registertovoteMA.com.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS

- Absentee voting requires an application for each calendar year and is available for all Elections.
- Absentee requests can be made for multiple elections in any given calendar year.
- Absentee requests can be made up until noon on the day before an election.

DPW Services:

- Snow plowing and sanding; programs for maintenance of town streets, sidewalks, rights of way, traffic signs and signals, street sweeping, and drainage systems; and maintenance, repair, reconstruction, and replacement of the Town's infrastructure
- Annual hazardous waste pick up day and fall leaf pick up
- White Goods and electronic recycling can be paid for at Town Hall and then dropped off at the Town Garage with receipt
- Recycling for unwanted books, hard plastics, and textiles can also be found at the Town Garage
- Contact the DPW Office with any inquiries for the Tree Warden

Trash, Compost and Recycling are all picked up weekly.

Mondays: Arbor Street to Beverly and all side streets in between.

Tuesdays: Monument Street, Cherry Street, to Danvers, Beverly and Topsfield town lines and all streets in between.

- Each residence is issued a 35 gallon Town of Wenham black container for household waste (non-compostable or recyclable waste) and a green organic waste container.
- Additionally, 1 Large item is allowed to be put out each week (no metal or wood).
- Additional trash can be put out in official Town of Wenham green trash bags which can be purchased at Aubuchon's in North Beverly or Crosby's in Hamilton.
- Organic waste must be in the green Wenham barrel.
- Single stream recyclables can be put out in any container with a "Recyclable" sticker on the container. Stickers are available from the Town Clerk.
- All trash, compost and recyclables must be at the curb by 7am on pick up day.
- Simplerecycling.com pink bags need to be out at curb before 7am on your trash day. Call them at 1-866-835-5068 for more information.
- Yard waste is not picked up by Wenham but can be dropped off at Brick Ends Farm in Hamilton by calling 978-468-3131.

- ◇ **Requests:** If we don't have it we can request it from elsewhere; items "on shelf" typically arrive in 3-5 days. Need to search wider? Turn it over to our super researchers of Inter-Library Loan.
- ◇ **Classes:** *Universal Class* offers over 500 courses, or try *Rocket Languages* which even includes American Sign Language.
- ◇ **HELP!** E-reader trouble? Can't get audio-books on your iPad? Schedule some 1:1 time with a librarian and get sorted out.
- ◇ **Events:** Our monthly newsletter keeps you up-to-date on author visits, programs, lectures, story times, workshops, & more.
- ◇ **Wowbrary** will email you a weekly list of what's newly added to the collection.
- ◇ **Connections:** Yes, we have book clubs (titles are typically on display), knitting groups, bridge, occasional writing support groups, and an ESL group.

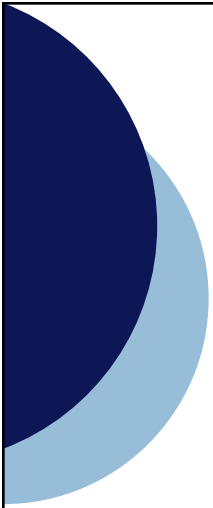
